### ELIGIBILITY AND DEADLINES

1. The Golden Empire Council, with the approval of the BSA National Court of Honor, may present the Silver Beaver Award to a **Scouter who has given Noteworthy Service of Exceptional Character to Youth and is currently registered in this Council.** The nominee must be 21 years of age or older and a volunteer Scouter. The award may not be presented posthumously. Former professional Scouters will not be considered within 5 years of their leaving employment with the BSA. Current Council employees are NOT eligible for consideration.
2. **The nomination must be submitted on the Silver Beaver Award Nomination Form complete with original signatures.** Out-of-date forms will not be accepted for evaluation. All sections of all pages should include as much information as possible for best consideration of the nominee.
3. **The nomination form must be submitted to the nominee's District Chairman, District Commissioner, or District Executive before the 1<sup>st</sup> Monday in October.** District Officials should verify the nominee's registration, tenure, and awards. Forms that are not signed by one of the nominee's District Officials will not be evaluated.
4. New nomination forms must be submitted each year; they will NOT be carried over from the previous year.
5. Selections will be made on a "blind" basis (this first page will be removed during evaluation).

## Guidelines for Completing the Nomination Form

All the information that supports the nomination must be put on this form. Do not include additional letters, statements, or documents with this form. Any extra documents will be removed before the evaluation starts. Only the information that is put on this form will be considered.

Enter the facts in each section. Write comments in the spaces provided without using the person's name. Your comments are important. This is your chance to give details about some of the accomplishments listed in that section.

The nomination form can be completed without the nominee's knowledge, but to get complete information their help may be necessary to give them the best chance for successful nomination.

### Specific guidelines for each section:

- I. Registered Service to Scouting. Enter the total number of years that the nominee has been a registered adult Scouter. One year of registration equals one year of service, regardless of the number of positions held during that year. Show all primary and multiple-registered positions that the nominee has held during the years he/she has been a registered Scouter in any BSA council.
- II. Participant In Training Courses (As Student or Staff). 2 Pages. List all the formal training courses completed by the nominee as well as formal staff or faculty member positions held at the district, council, area, region, and national levels.
- III. Attendance and Leadership For Events and Activities. List all events attended and leadership positions held by the nominee during events or activities attended at the unit, district, council, area, region, and national levels.
- IV. Awards For Adult Recognition. List all training and performance awards that the nominee will have received by the time this form is completed. Do not list any pending or future awards.
- V. Fiscal Responsibility. Show how active the nominee is in the financial health of the council. Do not list any dollar amounts.
- VI. Service to Youth in Organizations Other than Scouting. Describe the nominee's standing in the community in terms of outstanding service to youth in organizations other than Scouting. List activities in which the individual is most active in business, professional, civic, religious, educational, fraternal, veteran, rural and other organizations exclusive of Scouting *which serve Youth*. For each of the organizations listed, give the names of the organization, titles of positions held, and dates of service, and number of years of *service to youth* in the community
- VII. (Optional) Additional Comments of Exceptional Character Not Mentioned in Previous Sections. Describe how the nominee has contributed to the betterment of the Scouting and other youth programs in the Golden Empire Council service area. What has he/she done that is considered to be above and beyond a person's usual level of service to youth?
