Please take some time to study the Leader’s Guide to Scout Expo 2007. The Scout Expo 2007 planning committee has taken great care in creating a special event for the scouts of the Golden Empire Council. Information in this guide will help scouts and your unit have a successful experience at this event. Because Scout Expo 2007 is being held on a military installation we must take special steps to insure the security and safety of the property and the participants in the program. Extra attention must be given to entry procedures to guarantee a quick and efficient entrance into Beale Air Force Base. The military has requested we follow very specific instructions and rules in order for the Boy Scouts of America to use the facility.

**One of the key points that should not be missed is that all registration for Scout Expo 2007 will be done on-line.** All units and individuals participating in this event must register before the September 15, 2007 registration deadline. Please work with your unit to assure no one misses Scout Expo 2007. Register early for this great event. **There will be no on-site registration for this event.**

Remember that this event was planned and organized by volunteers like you. Planning an event of this size has taken many hours and the spirit of scouting will help make this a special event for all who attend.

## Scout Expo 2007 General Information

**Location:** Beale Air Force Base, near Maryville, California. A map is provided in this Leader's Guide. Form Page F. Entry Gates into Beale Air Force Base will be announced on your registration confirmation.

**Who May Participate:** All registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. Scout Expo 2007 has a program for all levels of scouting. Cubs, Webelos, Boy Scouts, Varsity, Venturing, and Explorers may participate. Adult leaders are encouraged to attend this special event.

**Dates and Times:** Friday, September 28 – Sunday, September 30, 2007

**Entry and Registration Requirements:** Please make sure you adhere to these requirements. **Failure to meet the following steps will result in your unit or individuals not being allowed to enter Beale Air Force Base.**

- Registration:** All participants must register for Scout Expo 2007 on-line, by September 15, 2007. The military must have a list of all scouts and leaders by this deadline. The Golden Empire Council is expecting over 5,000 scouts and leaders. We must provide the United States Air Force with an accurate list.
- Drivers:** All drivers must be identified in your on-line registration. Drivers of each vehicle must provide the following.
  - **Current Valid Driver License**
  - **Current Vehicle Registration**
  - **Proof of Auto Insurance**
 Drivers will be asked to present these certificates when entering the Wheatland Gate at Beale Air Force Base. All drivers must be identified on the unit's registration application. All Scout Expo 2007 Staff must pre-register.
- Participants:** All scouts and leaders participating in Scout Expo 2007 must provide Boy Scout Identification Numbers for the on-line registration process. This identification number can be secured from your charter or from the council's on-line advancement and membership website. Please ask your advancement chairperson for assistance in securing these identification numbers. All scouts and leaders must be registered. All Adults must be carrying a Photo Identification or Valid Drivers License.
- Consent and Hold Harmless Agreement and Release of Liability Forms:** All participants adult and youth must present a Consent and Hold Harmless Agreement and Release of Liability Form in order to participate in Scout Expo 2007. This form will be collected at registration. Please refer to the Forms Page A for a copy for youth and Forms Page B for a copy for adults. All Staff members must present a signed copy of this form.

5. **Local Tour Permit:** All units must file a Local Tour Permit to the scout office prior Scout Expo 2007. Unit leaders will be asked to present a copy of the Local Tour Permit at the check in area. Tour Permits can be obtained in the forms section of the Golden Empire Council Website. See Forms Page C.
6. **Unit Roster:** All units will be asked to present a final roster of participants at the check in area. See Forms Page D.
7. **Permission Slips:** All youth participants must have a signed parent permission slip. Unit leaders will be asked to present these forms at check in area. Unit leaders will keep the forms available during Scout Expo 2007. See Forms Page E for the form to be used.
8. **T-Shirt Sizes:** Please provide T-shirt sizes for all paying participants. This must be included in your On-Line Registration. T-shirts will be issued upon check in. Scout and leaders will be asked to wear their T-shirts to the Arena Show on Saturday night.

**Registration and Entry Check List:** Please make sure the following forms and/or steps are secured and filled out before Scout Expo 2007.

1. \_\_\_ **Complete On-line registration.** Deadline September 15, 2007
2. \_\_\_ **Drivers. Must have Vehicle Registration, Proof of Insurance, and Current Drivers License.**
3. \_\_\_ All participants must use the **Golden Empire Council/Boy Scouts of America Member Identification Number** on the On-line Registration Form. **All Adults must be carrying California Identification or California Drivers License.**
4. \_\_\_ All participants must sign a **Consent and Hold Harmless Agreement and Release of Liability Form.** This form will be collected at check in.
5. \_\_\_ All units must show a **Local Tour Permit** at check in. (Only one Tour Permit required for a Cub Pack)
6. \_\_\_ All units must submit a **Unit Roster** at check in.
7. \_\_\_ All youth must have a signed **Parent Permission Form** provided in this leader's guide.
8. \_\_\_ Provide **T-Shirt sizes** for all participants.

Don't forget there will be **NO ON SITE REGISTRATION**. All participants must be registered by September 15, 2007.

**Early Check Out Procedures:** All units who would like to check out early must follow procedures outlined by the Sub Camp Chief or Program Area Director. Please notify the check in team that you will be checking out early. Individuals leaving Scout Expo early must make prior arrangements with the Sub Camp Staff, Scout Leader, and parents. Scouts may have to make arrangements to meet parents at one of the gates with a Scout Leader present.

**Two Deep Leadership:** The Boy Scouts of America require that a minimum of two adult leaders be present with each unit during any activity. One adult must be over the age of 21 years old. The second adult may be 18 years old or older. The chartered organization is responsible for ensuring that sufficient leadership is provided for all activities.

**Parking:** Parking will be assigned as you arrive at Beale Air Force Base. Please follow directions to your appropriate program areas, as Cub Scouts and Webelos will have their own check in areas. Boy Scout/Venturing/Exploring will check in at their respective Sub Camps. Please cooperate with Beale Air Force Base Security, Military Police, and Law Enforcement Explorers as you move about the base. Your safety and cooperation is their highest priority during this event.

**Parking Permits:** Program Areas and Sub Camp Administration will be issuing Parking Permits for pre-assigned parking areas. Vehicles should not be moved once assigned a parking area. Vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. Only pre-approved vehicles may move about the Scout Expo 2007 grounds. Please see administrative services for special consideration. Handicap permits will be honored.

## Program Areas

**Cub Scout Landing Zone:** Cub Scouts may participate in the Cub Scout Landing Zone. Cubs will be able to visit the Beale Air Force Base Flight Line and view the famous U-2 Spy plane, Remote Piloted Global Hawk, KC-135 Tanker, and other Air Force Displays. Also Cubs will be able to participate in a number of interactive games, Cub Scout activities, and ranges. We ask that the Cub Scouts, and adult leaders bring a dinner for their evening meal. A limited concession stand will be available selling hot dogs, drinks, and snacks. After dinner, Scout Expo will present a special Arena Show that will feature great entertainment and ceremonies. Following the Arena Show Cubs will depart for home. Remember, there are no provisions for Cub Scout Camping overnight.

**Registration:** Please make sure that you follow all Entry and Registration Steps outlined in the leader's guide. Here is a quick review:

Shade is very limited, so BE PREPARED.

**Webelos Academy:** Webelos and their Adult Partners will experience Scout Expo 2007 in a unique way. Webelos are encouraged to stay overnight on Saturday, September 29, 2007, with their adult partners. Activities for the Webelos include a BB gun range, interactive games, special Webelos activities, flight line visits, viewing the Boy Scout Sub Camps, Action Alley, and a special Bar B Que dinner. After the Bar B Que Webelos will mobilize with the Boy Scouts for a special march to the Arena Show, so be prepared. The Arena Show will be the highlight of Scout Expo 2007. On Sunday morning, after breakfast, Webelos can participate in the various Scout religious observances. Webelos will check out by noon and head home.

**Webelos Adult Partners:** Webelos participating in the overnight program must be accompanied by an adult partner. Adult Partners are required to pay the participation fee. Webelos and adults will receive a T-Shirt, Scout Expo 2007 Patch, Saturday dinner, and Sunday Breakfast. Partial fees for non-overnight stays are not available.

**Boy Scout, Varsity, and Venturing Program:** Our goal is for every Scout, Varsity Scout, Crew Member, and Adult Leader, to have a National Jamboree-like experience at Scout Expo 2007. The Scout Expo 2007 staff has worked hard to provide areas that simulate a National Jamboree on a smaller scale. Participants may experience the Merit Badge Midway, Action Alley, Community Showcase, Flight Line Exhibits, Sub Camp Operations, Arena Show Mobilization, Arena Show, Scout Religious Services, and much more. We expect almost 5,000 total participants. The Boy Scout/Varsity/Venturing portion of Scout Expo will be divided into three large Sub Camps, U-2, Global Hawk, and SR-71. Each Sub Camp will house approximately 1,000 scouts and leaders. Each Sub Camp will hold evening colors and patrol/unit competition.

**Fires:** The Air Force and the Scout Expo 2007 has requested that No Open Fires be allowed. All cooking must be done on Propane Stoves.

**Water:** Water will be very limited in availability. Please make sure your unit brings plenty of water for drinking, cooking, and cleaning. Water will be available from designated areas, but may be a long haul from your Sub Camp. Please be prepared to carry water over a long distance. The use of a large container for water is encouraged. Wagons or hand trucks are a good idea to haul water containers.

## Boy Scout Program Areas

**Opening Ceremonies:** Scouts will participate in an opening ceremony on the morning of Saturday, September 29, 2007. All scouts will gather to honor our flag and receive a welcome message from the Scout Expo 2007 Staff.

**Merit Badge Midway:** Merit Badges will be introduced to Boy Scouts at the Merit Badge Midway. The purpose of this area will be to give scouts an idea about possible merit badges to earn on their trail to Eagle or earning Eagle Palms. Boy Scouts and Adult Leaders should not expect boys to earn a merit badge at Scout Expo, but to sample what is available to them. Some exhibits may give a scout a certificate for PARTS of merit badge completed. The intent of this area is to introduce many different and non-traditional merit badges that scouts can earn. Please feel free to contact our staff if you would like to showcase a merit badge at Scout Expo 2007

**Action Alley:** Hands on activities will be available for scouts and crew members to enjoy. Activities like Pioneering, Geo-Caching, Sea Scout Challenge, Mountain Man, and more will be there for scouts to try out. The United States Military will be providing climbing walls, simulators, and obstacle courses to challenge all scouts. If your unit would like to be part of the Action Alley please contact our Scout Expo 2007 Staff. Participation in the Action Alley will be fun and rewarding.

**Community Showcase:** Many agencies, organizations, and associations work with the Boy Scouts of America to support our program. Visit the Community Showcase Area and find out how they support Scouting. Also Visitors can find out how to get involved with these groups. One of the groups on tap for the Community Showcase Area is the California Waterfowl Association. They are attempting to set a world record by building 300 Wood Duck Boxes to be used throughout California. They will be recruiting your help to make this happen. Other government and agencies will be on hand to get you involved in making our communities a better place to live.

**Flight Line:** Beale Air Force Base has rolled out the Red Carpet to the Scouts and Scouters of the Golden Empire Council. On display will be the remote controlled Global Hawk Reconnaissance Plane, the famous U-2 Spy Plane, and the KC 135 Refueling Tanker. The Air Force will also be showcasing static display prepared for Air Force Week 2007 held earlier this year. This promises to be an informative and interesting area for all scouts and leaders.

**Sub Camp Competition:** The following patrol competition may be available in each Sub Camp:

**Sub Camp Ceremonies:** Each Sub Camp will have evening flags with ceremonies conducted by one of the Sub Camp troops. Sub Camps will present competition awards to the top 4 patrols/troops/troops/crews at Saturday evening flags.

**Gateway and Campsites:** Each unit will be allocated a specific amount of camping space depending on the numbers registered for the event. Units are asked to have a gateway to mark the entrance to their campsite. While space may not be an issue at Dragon Town we are asking gateways be no larger than 30 feet long and 15 feet high.

**Sub Camp Services:** Each Sub Camp will have a headquarters area that will have personnel available from noon Friday through noon Sunday. Each Sub Camp will have available First Aid, a lost and found, and communication equipment for contacting medical personnel, security and the main headquarters. There will also be a small maintenance area.

**Sub Camp Unit Leadership:** There will be a meeting with the troop SPL, Team Leader, Crew Presidents and Scoutmasters and Advisors, Friday evening at 9:00 PM to go over Saturday and Sunday events. **A Scout is Reverent:** The Scout Law emphasizes that a Scout is Reverent. On Sunday, September 30, 2007, Scout Expo 2007 will host several denominational and a non-denominational religious services. Please listen for announcements about which churches will be conducting services. A collection for the World Friendship will be held at each service. The World Friendship Fund encourages the support of Scouting around the world, especially in under developed nations. Please consider giving to this worthy cause. Please advise your scouts about this event in advance.

## Program for All Levels

**Arena Show and Mobilization:** The Scout Expo 2007 Arena Show promises to be an event you will not forget. Entertainment and Ceremonies that will be remembered for a long time will be presented by the Arena Show Staff. A moving Scout Rededication Ceremony will close the Arena Show.

Please remember that the Arena Show will require a hike of 2.3 miles. Mobilization will be just like at the National Jamboree. Leaders are to plan on walking to the Arena Show as a unit. A special light or flag is very useful in keeping your unit together, especially after dark.

Each unit is asked to bring their United States flag and Unit flag. Please remove extra ribbons and awards from your flagpole. Flag bearers will be asked to form at the front of the Sub Camp line. Special instructions will be given at the Friday night orientation. Flag bearers are considered to be honored scouts so please select them carefully. They must be able to follow specific instructions and must be independent and responsible.

Some buses will be available for Scouts and Scouters who think they may have difficulty walking the distance to the Arena Show. Please check with your Sub Camp Staff for transportation information.

## More Scout Expo 2007 Information

**Administrative Services:** Administration is composed of hospitality, transportation, public relations, registration, emergency services, provision of staff housing and meals, communications, chaplain services, medical services under the chief physician or nurses, trading post, information services, commissioners, and the program service composed of activities and mobilization, and program scheduling.

**Administration.** The mission of the administration service is to:

- Provide communications between Sub Camps and Headquarters
- Provide a service for the distribution and collection of messages.
- Provide a hospitality center for VIPs and Guests
- Provide liaison between administration and the News service organizations.
- Provide a transportation coordination
- Provide a focal point for master schedule of activities and changes
- Provide centralized location for health and safety, security, and physical arrangements
- Provide inter-camp communications as a liaison between the Sub Camp and the commissioner service
- Provide a central location for staff services
- Provide for emergency services and coordination of emergency situations.

**Communications Within Scout Expo 2007:** Your Sub Camp Administration will have communication to other Expo areas for essential communications by a dedicated cell phone network. Please limit your use to critical needs.

The Expo site covers a large area with widespread activities. We strongly recommend your unit bring FRS radios to assist in communicating within your unit. If you do bring FRS radios, upon registration your unit will be issued an exclusive channel and code number. Please use only this combination to avoid disrupting the use by other Scout units. These radios should prove quite useful in coordinating meal times, your equipment movements and travel during the Arena Show. Be sure you have adequate batteries.

Scouts and Scouters with radio amateur licenses are invited to participate at our radio amateur station K6BSA. Please indicate your interest in advance by sending email to: [K6KN@billragdale.cc](mailto:K6KN@billragdale.cc) Expo participants will be able to send messages home from this Midway radio station and experience ham communications by HF, VHF and IRLP.

**Uniforming:** The Scout Expo 2007 Staff would like to encourage scouts and leaders to wear the Boy Scout uniform with pride. This is a unique event that highlights the Boy Scout program. Please encourage your scouts to wear the Scout Uniform during the opening flag ceremony. The activity uniform is encouraged during the day. We ask that all participants wear the Scout Expo 2007 T-shirt to the Arena Show. This will be a huge photo opportunity.

**Transportation:** On Saturday, September 29, 2007, Scout Expo will be furnishing a limited number of buses to transport scouts and leaders to and from the Flight Line and other program areas. Please remember to give priority to scouts and scouters with disabilities, guests, and older scouters. Bus Schedules will be announced in Sub Camps and Program Areas.

**Scout Shop:** Welcome to Scout Expo 2007. The River City Scout Shop will be open on Saturday the 29th. The Scout Shop will be located adjacent to the Headquarters Area at Scout Expo 2007. We will have available for sale a wide variety of items for your camping and uniform needs. Stop by and see the latest new items, literature for all levels of scouting and craft items for your weekend enjoyment. If you have specific needs that the Scout Shop can provide, please email your requests at [etaylor@bsamail.org](mailto:etaylor@bsamail.org). Don't forget to stop by and check out the clearance items!

**Trading Post:** Bring cash for your purchases at the Trading Post!

Welcome to the trading post! Prior to and during the event the trading post will be the location to purchase your Scout Expo Souvenirs. Here are some of the items that the Trading Post expects to have at the event Mugs, Shirts, Hats, Patches, Carabineers, Dog Tags, and the DVD of the 2007 Scout Expo. The trading post hours will be posted at each of the trading posts. We look forward to seeing you at the Expo!

**Concessions:** Several concession stands will be available at Scout Expo 2007. Food, drinks, snacks, and bottled water will be available to supplement scout menus at this event. Some units plan on using the concessions stands so they do not have to return to their campsite during the lunch period.

**Patch Trading Area:** A patch trading area will be set up near the Scout Shop. Bring your patches for some great patch swapping. Please youth trade with youth and adults trade with adults.

## Health and Safety

### BSA Policies:

**Two Deep Leadership:** The Boy Scouts of America require that a minimum of two adult leaders be present with each unit during any activity. One adult must be over the age of 21 years old. The second adult may be 18 years old or older. The chartered organization is responsible for ensuring that sufficient leadership is provided for all activities.

**Smoking, Alcohol and Drugs:** To promote Scouting's aim of physical fitness among its participants as well as insure the protection and safe use of Beale Air Force Base, the Golden Empire Council requires all adult leaders who smoke to do so in designated smoking areas and are required to set the proper example by refraining from smoking in the presence of Scouts. The Sub Camp Chief will announce designated smoking areas. Under no circumstances are adult leaders to smoke in program areas.

The National Council, BSA prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at encampments involving the participation of youth members.

**Water:** It is critical that we keep all participants hydrated during this event. Water should be brought from home. Water bottles, water jugs, and other containers should be brought to Scout Expo 2007. Drinking water is available, but the distance to water supplies is lengthy. The use of a wagons or hand trucks may be a good idea for hauling water to your campsite. Please plan accordingly.

**Medical Services:** Medical support will be on hand to deal with emergency medical situations. The health and safety committee ask that units handle simple medical and health issues, such as minor cuts, scrapes, headaches, etc. Please do not hesitate to consult with the medical staff on site.

**Fire Safety:** Beale Air Force Base and the Golden Empire Council are very concerned about the extreme fire danger that exists during the later part of the month of September. Dry grass and weather conditions create a dangerously high fire condition. Please be aware that cooking is to be done on propane stoves only. Under no circumstances will open fires be allowed at Beale Air Force Base. Please clear a safe area around cooking areas to prevent possible fires. The use of filled fire buckets filled with water and/or buckets filled with sand will be required in cooking areas. Fire extinguishers are highly recommended. Sub Camp Safety Officers will be

visiting each campsite to check for fire safety precautions taken by each troop. Scout Leaders should appoint a safety officer for each campsite. Please provide the appropriate tools for fire safety in your camp.

Fireworks of any sort are illegal and strictly prohibited at Scout Expo 2007. Possession of fireworks will be grounds for immediate dismissal from Beale Air Force Base and could result in criminal prosecution.

**Firearms:** Personal firearms and ammunition are prohibited at Scout Expo 2007 and any scout outing. BSA National Standards, as well as insurance requirements, prohibit the use of either item at Scout Expo 2007. They may not be used at ranges. Due to new regulations and an extension of state law, personal archery equipment is also not allowed.

**Waste Disposal:** Waste disposal sites will be available at Scout Expo 2007. Please put all disposable waste in plastic bags and place in appropriate containers. Units should provide plastic bags for garbage collection.

**Grey Water:** All grey water must be deposited in appropriate grey water collection tanks. Please do not throw grey water on the ground.

**Recycling:** Scout Expo 2007 will provide appropriate recycling containers for plastic, cans, and other recyclable materials.

**Shade:** Very little shade is available at Beale Air Force Base. Units are encouraged to set up dining flies, pop up awnings, and/or other covering devices to protect individuals from the weather.

**Siblings:** Unfortunately we cannot accommodate young children and siblings at this event. Insurance restrictions, military requirements, liability, and safety issues restrict participation in Scout Expo 2007 to only registered youth members and adult leaders of the Boy Scouts of America. Your cooperation with this policy will be critical to the success of Scout Expo 2007. We do not want to have to send anyone home at the gate because they are not a registered participant.
