Code of Conduct and Participant Statement of Understanding

1. The unit's adult leaders (Scoutmaster and assistants) are responsible for the supervision of the unit's membership in respect to maintaining discipline, security, and the Jamboree Code of Conduct.
2. The Scout Oath and Law will be my guide throughout the Jamboree.
3. I will set a good example by keeping myself neatly dressed and presentable. (The official Scout uniform and Jamboree identifying items are the only acceptable apparel.)
4. I will attend all scheduled programs and participate as required in cooperation with other unit members and leaders.
5. In consideration of other unit participants, I agree to follow the bedtime and sleep schedule of the unit, unless otherwise directed by the Jamboree program.
6. I will be responsible for keeping my tent and personal gear labeled, clean, and neat. I will adhere to all Jamboree recycling policies and regulations. I will do my share to prevent littering of the Jamboree grounds.
7. I understand that the purchase, possession, or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs by any youth or adult member is prohibited. This standard shall apply to all participants – both youth and adult.
8. Serious and/or repetitive behavior violations including cheating, stealing, dishonesty, swearing, fighting and profanity may result in expulsion from the Jamboree and/or serious disciplinary action and loss of privileges. Upon arrival at Fort A.P. Hill, the Jamboree director must be contacted for the expulsion procedure to be invoked. There are no exceptions.
9. I understand that gambling of any form is prohibited.
10. I understand that possession of lasers of any type, and possession or detonation of fireworks is prohibited.
11. I will demonstrate respect for unit and Jamboree property and be personally responsible for any loss, breakage, or vandalism of property as a result of my actions.
12. Neither the unit leader nor the Jamboree Division, BSA, will be responsible for loss, breakage, or theft of personal items. I will label all my personal items and check items of value at the direction of unit leaders. Theft will be grounds for expulsion.
13. While participating in the action centers, aquatics, and other activities, I will obey the safety rules and

instructions of all supervisors and staff members.

14. In accordance with U.S., local, and state laws, adult leaders and youth are prohibited from having firearms and weapons in their possession.
15. Scoutmasters and assistants will be guided by the Scout Oath and Scout Law and will obey all U.S., local, and state laws.
16. Scoutmasters and assistants must receive Youth Protection training and follow the guidelines therein prior to Pre-Jamboree training.
17. Hazing has no place in Scouting. Nor do running the gauntlet, belt lines, or similar physical punishments. Leaders and older youth must prevent any youth from being "initiated" into the troop with hazing.
18. Adult leaders should have the good judgment to avoid trading souvenirs or patches with a child or youth members in Scouting. Youth members may trade with youth members. Adult leaders may trade only with other adults 18 years of age or older.
19. Adult leaders and youth leaders must instruct youth to avoid confrontation with groups, demonstrators, or hecklers and must assume a passive reaction to name-calling from individuals or groups. Units or groups must be removed from the area of potential conflict immediately.
20. Serious violation of this code may result in expulsion from the Jamboree at the participant's own expense. All decisions will be final.

Statement of Understanding: Leaders are selected to represent the Golden Empire Council (GEC) based on qualifications in character, camping skills, physical and personal fitness, and leadership. With completion and submission of this application, I the undersigned do hereby agree to live the Scout Oath and Law and to obey and cooperate with Jamboree leaders, to meet my full responsibility as a member of the GEC Jamboree contingent, take such preliminary Jamboree training as may be required, and to wear the official jamboree uniform. I further attest that I have read the Code of Conduct and Statement of Understanding as a condition of participation. It is with the further understanding that serious misconduct or infraction of rules and regulations may result in expulsion, at the participant's expense, from the Jamboree or during the Jamboree tour. I have also read the duties of the position for which I have been selected and do hereby confirm that I am capable of fulfilling said duties during the months preceding the jamboree, during the tour, traveling to and from the Jamboree, and while at Jamboree.

Payments of Jamboree registrations fees, tour or equipment costs will be made in accordance with guidelines as set forth by the Jamboree committee for contingent troop leaders. All fees must be paid on or before the dates imposed by the Jamboree committee. Failure to make payments in a timely and responsible manner shall constitute breach of this agreement and shall result in removal from the position with forfeiture of all fees previously collected.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from participation in the 2010 National Scout Jamboree, any and all claims against the Boy Scouts of America, the Capitol Area Council, the United States of America, or any of the officers, employees, agents, or other representatives of any of them, or any other persons working under their direction or engaged in the conduct of their affairs, arising out of any accident, illness, injury, damage, or other loss or harm to or incurred or suffered by the applicant named herein or to his property, in connection with or incidental to the 2010 National Scout Jamboree, including preliminary training and travel, are hereby expressly waived by the applicant.

I understand that the jamboree will be covered by news media and moviemaking and broadcasting companies, and I hereby consent to the use of my voice and/or photograph in the news coverage, moviemaking or similar projects approved by the Boy Scouts of America.

2010 National Jamboree Adult Leader Job Description

Scoutmaster

1. Serves as the executive officer of the troop. Serves as the liaison for his/her troop to, and a voting member of, the Jamboree Contingent Committee.
2. Serves as a member of the Uniforms/Tours Committee.
3. Works through his/her Assistant Scoutmasters, senior patrol leader, and patrol leaders to ensure fulfillment of their duties.
4. Maintains policies and coordinates efforts of Assistant Scoutmasters.
5. Is personally responsible for the health, safety, and morale of his/her troop.
6. Is responsible at all times for the proper behavior and conduct of the members of his/her troop.
7. Receives a report from his/her senior patrol leader on bed check each evening after taps and reports those present, accounted for, or missing to the designated sub-camp staff member.
8. Serves as a liaison between the troop and the sub-camp leadership.
9. Assists in conducting Jamboree promotional rallies and in recruiting Scouts to attend the Jamboree.
10. Leads his/her participants in pre-jamboree training.
11. Accompanies his/her troop to and from the Jamboree.
12. By his/her example, serves as a role model for others to follow.

First Assistant Scoutmaster (Scheduling and Records)

1. Serves as troop leader in the absence of the Scoutmaster.
2. Serves as the liaison for his/her troop to and a voting member of the Administration/Finance Committee.
3. Is personally responsible for the troop's individual jamboree applications/contracts and medical records, and all troop records to include travel permits, hotel room assignments, gate passes, airline tickets, and other passes or permits necessitated by the tour package.
4. Works with the troop scribe in the handling of troop records and the notification of troop members of Jamboree activities and meetings.
5. Responsible for troop first aid and contacts the sub-camp medical officer on serious cases.
6. Maintains liaison with sub-camp communications officer.
7. Maintains the general morale of the troop, including distribution of mail and other communications.
8. Encourages Scout news correspondents to send news to their hometowns.
9. Assists in conducting Jamboree promotional rallies and in recruiting Scouts to attend the Jamboree.
10. Participates in pre-jamboree training.
11. Accompanies his/her troop to and from the Jamboree.
12. By his/her example, serves as a role model for others to follow.

Second Assistant Scoutmaster (Physical Arrangements)

1. Is responsible to the Scoutmaster for troop physical arrangements.
2. Serves as the liaison for his/her troop to and a voting member of the Equipment /Logistic Committee.
3. Works with the troop quartermaster in the issuance of supplies, movement and security of equipment.
4. Is responsible for the design, construction, and installation of the troop gateway.
5. Arranges directly with the sub-camp equipment and maintenance officer for supplies.
6. Working through and with the quartermaster and patrol leaders, trains and oversees the patrols in their tasks of drawing food and food supplies, preparation and serving of food, and cleaning up.
7. Consults regularly with patrol cooks on the most effective ways to prepare daily food selections.
8. Meets daily with the patrol cooks and firemen, giving briefings on food preparation and safety precautions.
9. Oversees camp sanitation and cleanup operations after each meal.
10. Is responsible for the care and neat appearance of all equipment.

11. Is responsible for transportation of troop equipment and personal baggage to and from the Jamboree.
12. Assists in conducting Jamboree promotional rallies and in recruiting Scouts to attend the Jamboree.
13. Participates in pre-jamboree training.
14. Accompanies his/her troop to and from the jamboree.
15. By his/her example, serves as a role model for others to follow.

Third Assistant Scoutmaster (Troop Activities)

1. Is responsible to the Scoutmaster for program and activities of the troop, including pageants and campfires.
2. Serves as the liaison for his/her troop to, and a voting member of, the pre-jamboree Training Committee.
3. Works with the assistant senior patrol leader in administering troop activities and participation in camp-wide events.
4. Serves as banker for troop and individual funds and coordinates sales with contingent trading post advisor for the troop.
5. Contacts the sub-camp activities director in handling routine matters.
6. Cares for troop and individuals exhibits.
7. Assists in conducting Jamboree promotional rallies and in recruiting Scouts to attend the Jamboree.
8. Participates in pre-jamboree training.
9. Accompanies his/her troop to and from the Jamboree.
10. By his/her example, serves as a role model for others to follow.

2010 National Scout Jamboree Unit Leader Qualification

Scoutmaster:

- Have served as Scoutmaster for at least one year during the three-year period prior to July 1, 2010.
- Completed basic *New Leader Essentials*, *Scoutmaster Specific* and *Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills*.
- Be able to serve as a role model of physical fitness.
- Have participated in the pre-jamboree training experience.
- Have filed a National Scout Jamboree Personal health & Medical Record, Class 3, before a pre-jamboree training with the Council Jamboree Committee.
- Complete the 90-minute *Youth Protection Training*.
- Be approved by the local council.
- Although not required, *Wood Badge* and/or *Scouter's Key* are desirable qualifications.

First Assistant Scoutmaster:

- Same Qualifications as Scoutmaster.

Second Assistant Scoutmaster:

- Be at least 25 years of age by July 1, 2010.
- Have served actively in an adult troop leadership position for at least one year during the three-year period prior to July 1, 2010.
- Have participated in the pre-jamboree training experience.
- Complete the 90-minute *Youth Protection Training*.
- Be approved by the local council.

Third Assistant Scoutmaster:

- Be at least 18 years of age (but not 26) by August *, 2010.
- Have served actively in a troop leadership position.
- Have participated in the pre-jamboree training experience.

- Have filed a National Scout Jamboree Personal health & Medical Record, Class 3, before a pre-jamboree training with the Council Jamboree Committee.
- Complete the 90-minute *Youth Protection Training*.
- Be approved by the local council.

Cost: The fee for adult leaders will be discounted. The Jamboree Committee has not established the final fees for the Jamboree at this time. The cost is estimated at between \$2,800 and \$3,500 for scouts. Please consider the cost of additional uniforms, vacation time needed, and material and supply costs when applying for this position. Leaders must be available for the dates of the Jamboree (July 26 – August 4, 2008) and the days before and after the Jamboree for touring (up to 10 days).
