9. CA State Law AB 506 – Angele Boudreaux
- a. What is it: Requires volunteers and staff of youth organizations to complete training in child abuse and neglect reporting, and to undergo Live Scan background checks.
 - b. Who does it affect:
 - i. All Employees, Registered Adult Volunteers/Leaders and Regular Volunteers
 - ii. 18 years +
 - iii. Direct contact with, or supervise children for more than:
 - 1. 16 hours/month or
 - 2. 32 hours/year
 - 3. Example: Merit Badge Councilors, Scout/Crew/Pack Leaders/Volunteers, Committee Leaders/Volunteers, Camp Councilors...
 - iv. Lion/Tiger Adult Partners are excluded
 - c. Requirements:
 - i. Complete the online CA Mandated Reporter Training
 - 1. Takes about 2 hours
 - 2. Good for 2 years
 - 3. Log on to <https://mandatedreporterca.com/training/volunteers>
 - a. Register as a Volunteer
 - b. Take the Training
 - c. When you take the training and stop in the middle of minor headings, the system will not save what you have done.
 - d. When you take the training and stop in the middle of major headings, the system will save what you have done.
 - ii. Upload the Certificate to the GEC Page on California Scouting Website
 - 1. <https://californiascouting.org/gec/>
 - 2. Scroll down to Step 2
 - iii. Complete the Live Scan Background check (the digital version of inked fingerprinting)
 - 1. <https://californiascouting.org/gec/>
 - 2. Scroll down to Step 3.
 - 3. Form is not available yet. GEC will send an email when the form is available.
 - 4. Locate a Live Scan site near you: <https://www.certifxlivescan.com/>
 - a. There is a fee for fingerprinting
 - i. Fingerprint rolling fee (\$20-40 per person)
 - ii. FBI Background check fee (\$17)
 - iii. DOJ Background check (\$0)
 - b. Check in your area who can do a Fingerprint Rolling.
 - c. In Dixon: Angleman's charges \$20

 - e. Tracking this information:
 - i. We recommend designating someone in your unit to track
 - 1. Who has taken the training
 - 2. When did they take the training
 - 3. A copy of their certificate
 - 4. Did they register and pay their fees
 - f. If you work/volunteer in two different councils; you need to complete a Live Scan Background check in each council.
 - g. Currently, there is no deadline when you or your unit needs to complete the 3 step process.
